

### Immunizations: Is Your Child Up to Date?

Hello families,

We hope your student had a great spring break! As summer is approaching it is time to start thinking about scheduling your student's [well child visit](#) and making sure they are up to date on vaccines. The Wisconsin Immunization Law requires that all students through grade 12 meet a minimum number of required immunizations prior to school attendance. These requirements can be waived only for health, religious or personal conviction reasons.

### DID YOU KNOW?



Students who are chronically absent in preschool through 1st grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade.



By 6th grade, chronic absence is a proven early warning sign for students at risk of dropping out of school.



Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is:

- Losing interest in school
- Struggling with school-work
- Dealing with a bully
- Facing some other difficulty

### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- ▶ Make school attendance a priority. Help your child to be on time to school.
- ▶ Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- ▶ Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, neighbor, or another parent to take your child to school.

### HOW DOES LATE ARRIVAL AFFECT STUDENTS?



Minutes late per day	Equal days work of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 Mins	6.9 days
15 Mins	10.3 days
20 Mins	13.8 days
30 Mins	20.7 days



Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half of students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.

### HOW TO CREATE A GOOD ROUTINE:



Set a daily schedule with the same wake-up times and bedtimes for each school day -- and stick to them.



Prepare morning routines the night before. Each night, have your student pick out their outfit, and have school supplies ready by the door. Being prepared the night before makes the morning routines simpler.

*A DPI funded ESSER grant-based collaboration between the AASD and the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Fox Valley*

**Participating schools:** Badger, Classical, Columbus, Edison, Foster, Highlands, Houdini, Huntley, Einstein, Kaleidoscope, Madison, and Wilson

**Grades:** Students entering 1<sup>st</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup> grades next fall

**Dates:** June 10<sup>th</sup> -July 19<sup>th</sup> (No school on 6/19, 7/4, 7/5)

**Purpose:** Provide opportunities for academic instruction and enrichment to help students practice their reading and math skills during summer. It will deliver targeted curriculum and academic programs to prevent summer learning loss. Staff will provide daily opportunities for socialization, structured enrichment activities designed to engage students with one another and adult mentoring to increase students' feelings of connectedness to peers. Staff will also provide weekly social emotional learning programs to assist students in developing stronger self-regulation skills and maintaining positive, productive relationships with peers, parents, and teachers.
